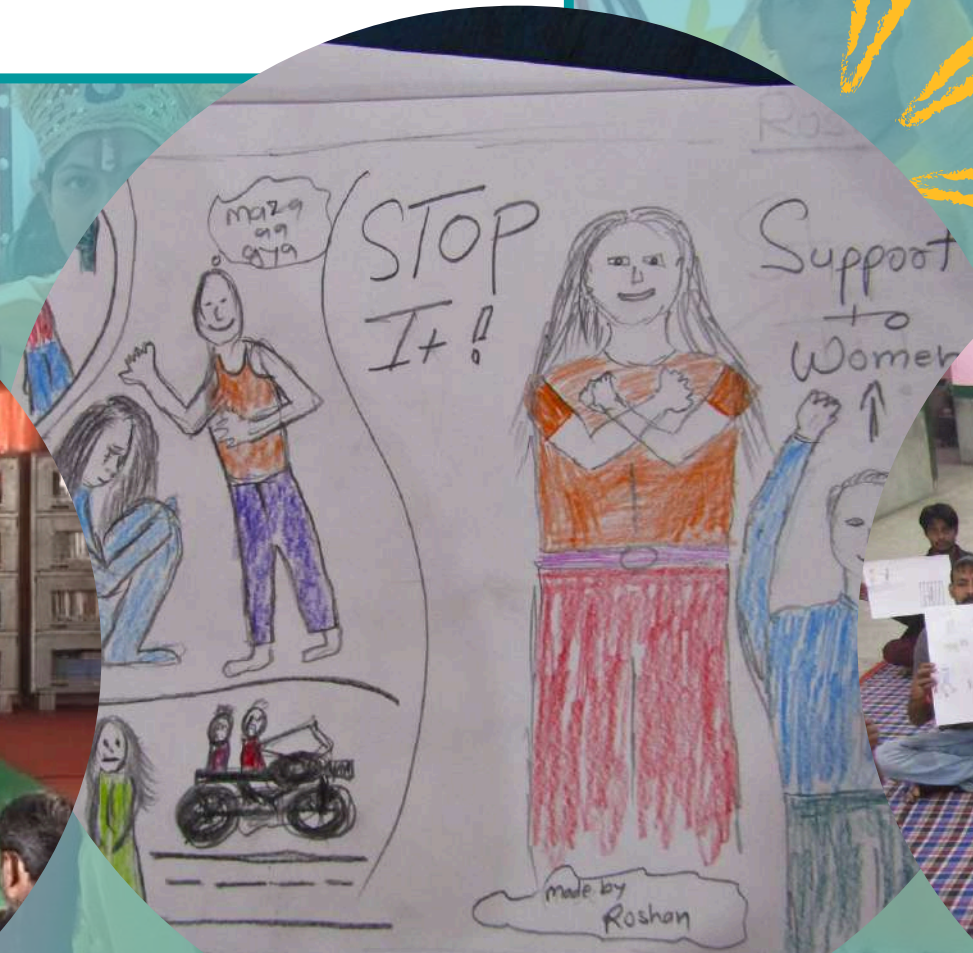

India Vision Foundation is running Creche inside Prison under its Early Childhood Care & Development (ECCD) Program which aims to engage with children of prison inmates by enrolling them in the inside prison day-care center, facilitating elementary education & holistic development through play-way methods. A clever mix of education, games, painting, music, and dance adds to the fun element of the learning process. of formal education, trauma-induced reactions to taking on parental responsibilities, etc.

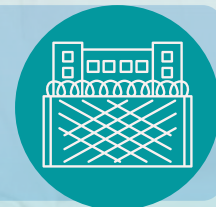

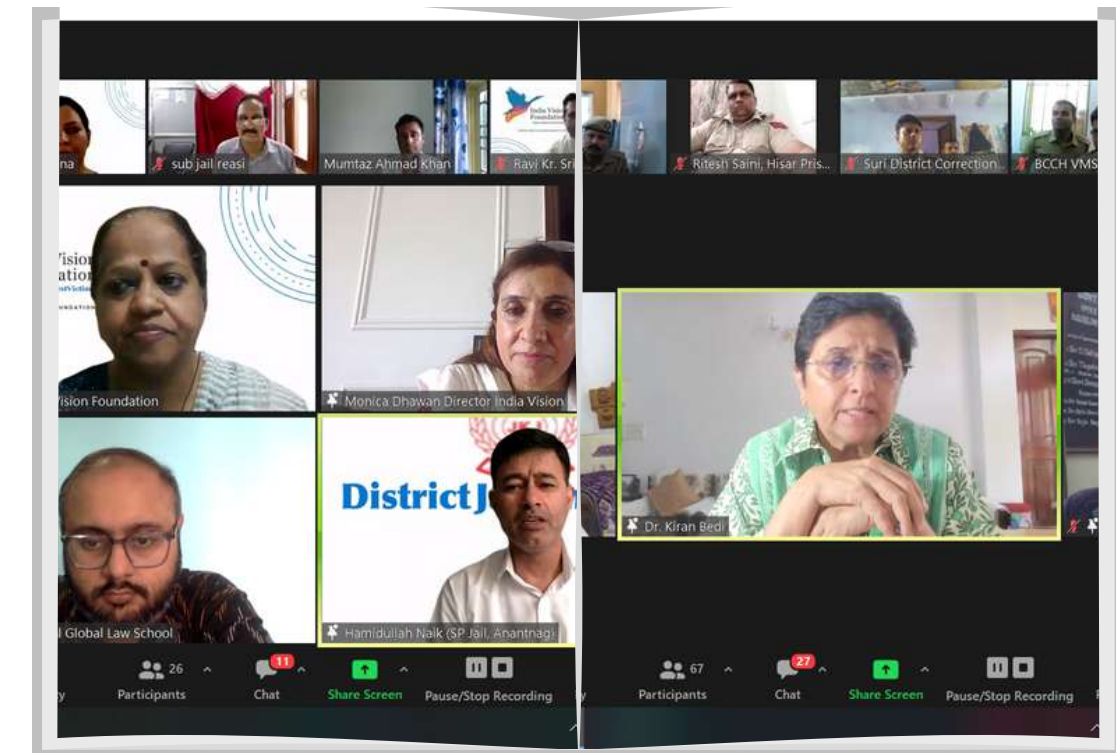

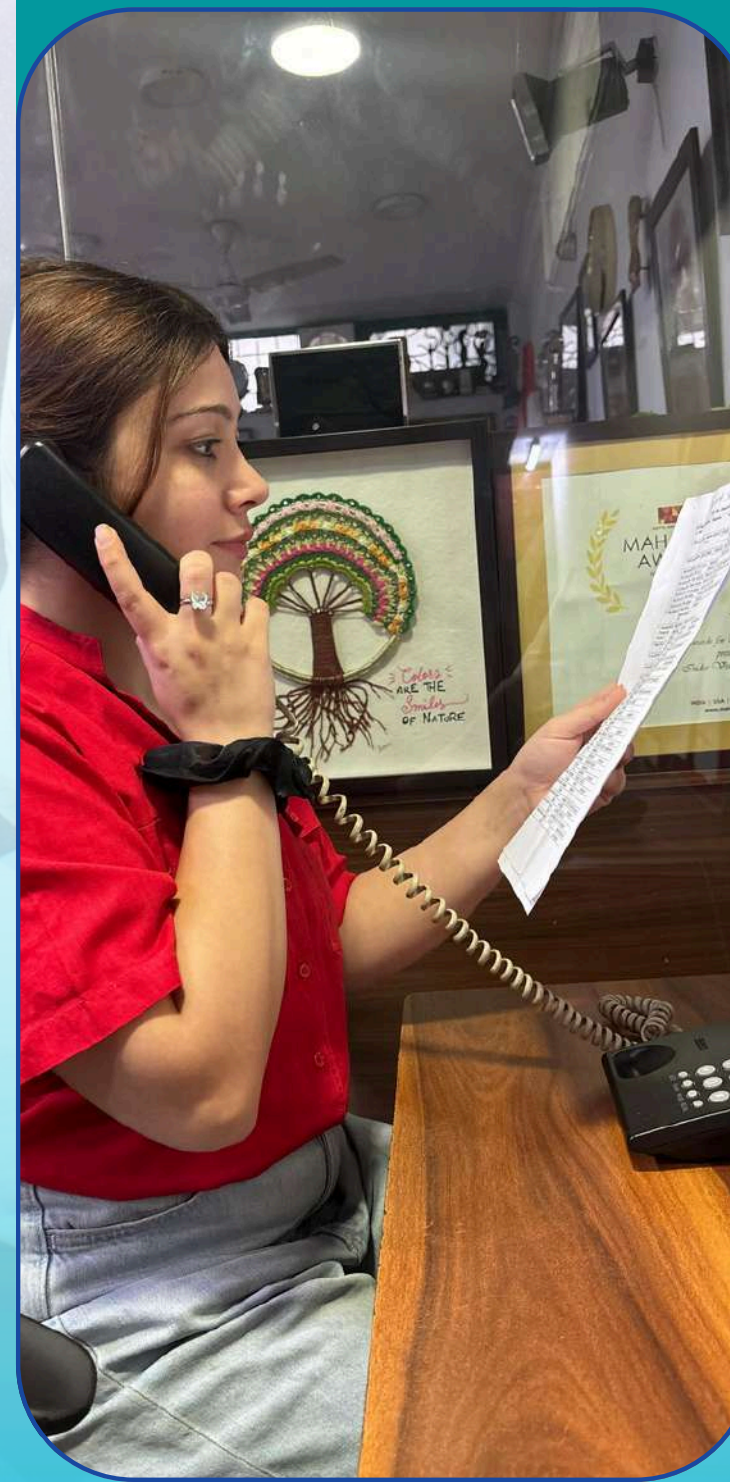

PROJECT ATMABAL

Protect Atambal, the brainchild of Ms. Saina Bharucha, Permanent Trustee, India Vision Foundation, was initiated for the female inmates of Yerwada Prison, Maharashtra.

Under the project, one-on-one sessions are conducted by Ms. Saina R. Bharucha with the female inmates. These sessions aim to tap into each inmate's inner faith and strength and bring inner transformation through mindfulness or self-awareness. Also, the prison visits have supported strengthening the Children of Families Program and the Rehabilitation Program of the India Vision Foundation.

Since the start of this initiative in October 2022, Ms Saina has continued to visit the Yerwada Prison and have heart-to-heart with the female inmates and helped to build their resilience. More than 70+ such sessions have fostered the values of self-realisation, introspection, and self-analysis in nearly 150+ female inmates of various ages and social strata.

In Ms Saina's words "The tenure each inmate spends in the prison is massive karma, and the premises of the jail are their karma bhoomi; either they succumb to the karma or they come out of it with a resolve to lead a dignified life.

But how does it all happen?

It happens with the power of grace, prayer, and kshama prarthana".

Ms. Saina is determined to continue the sessions of connecting with the inmates, as these sessions have offered them a space to share and reflect. The sessions have helped them look within and find the right path for themselves and for their children, who bear the brunt of being the children of incarcerated mothers and face stigma and ostracization in society. Thus, aligning with the mission of the India Vision Foundation #SaveTheNextVictim.

JAI DHARI MAA I just want them to tap into their inner courage and seek GOD'S GRACE to move forward. My focus during the one-on-one session is how to:

- convert pain into purpose.
- make them forgive themselves and others.
- make their emotions the strength.
- help them face the trials of life and empower themselves. "No Iron Bars can stop GRACE from entering one's life..."

About Us

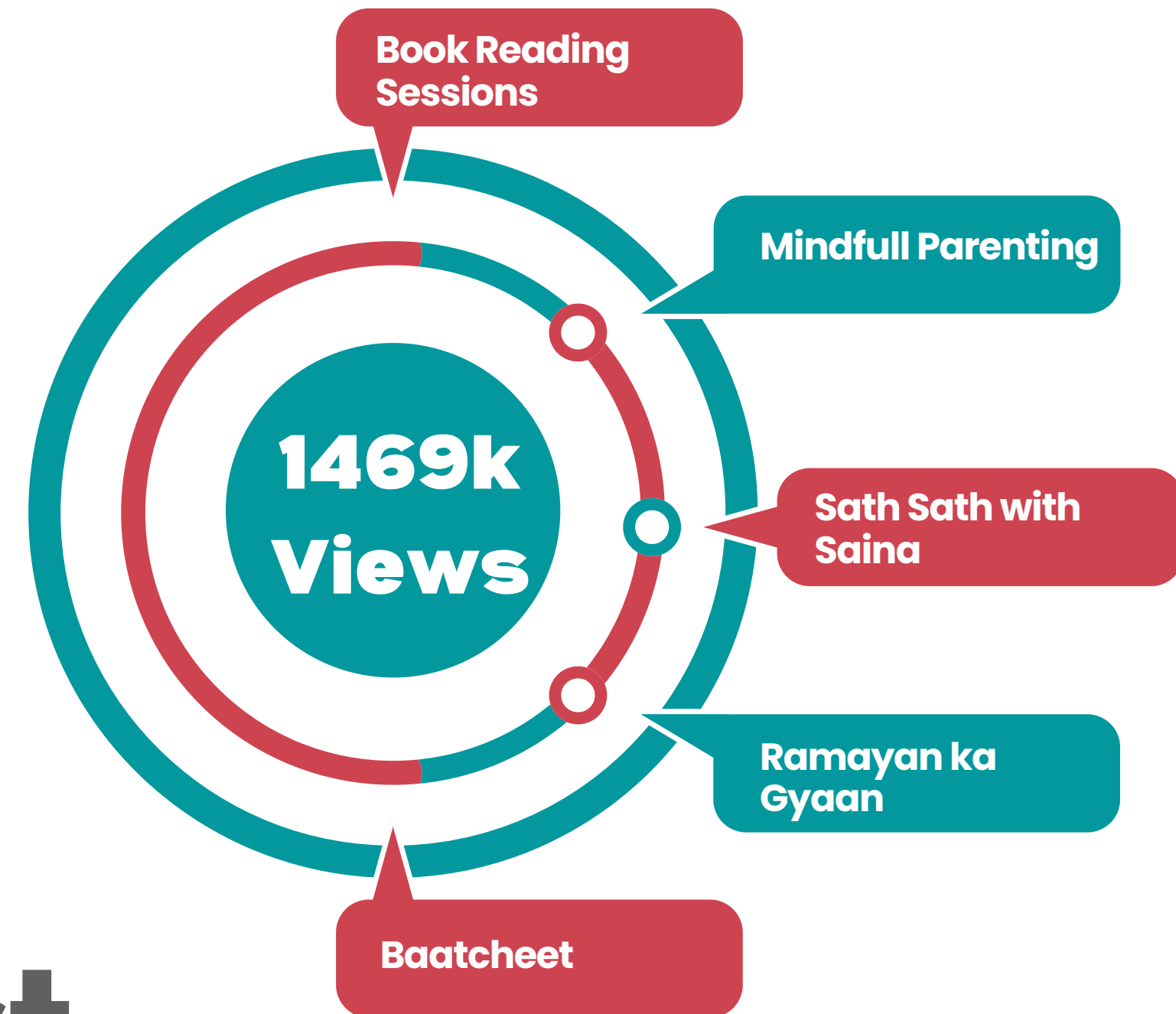

The aim of the project was to continue reaching out to more individuals through the virtual space when physical interaction and activities came to a standstill.

Since its inception, four years ago, Demonstrative Learning has organized more than 400 virtual programs. and has evolved during this period, to start a number of virtual programs. It is a platform to share value based programs and to encourage, develop and showcase the talent in young children/youth through interaction, discussions, mentoring, creative expression, stories, essays, and art forms

This endeavor not only enriched my professional skills but also offered a profound insight into the complexities of rehabilitation processes.

My internship at the India Vision Foundation proved to be an enriching journey, brimming with new

experiences, profound learnings and uncharted challenges. Over the course of the two-month period, my idea of prisons went through a significant shift. For the incarcerated. What particularly struck me was the admirable dedication of the foundation's team. The team, driven by a genuine commitment to rehabilitation, reintegration, and the welfare of prisoners.

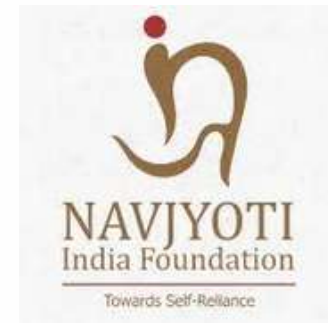
